The Depot Dilemma

At the end of November, the Stoughton
Historical Society learned that a group called
the Smet Foundation had proposed a Depot Hill
revitalization. The proposal has several components
with one being the sale of the Cities RR depot
which would be turned into offices.

This information came to us out of the blue. To confirm this, on November 21, Nancy Hagen, (President of the Stoughton Historical Society) called Mayor Swadley and Chamber President, Sarah Ebert, to find out the details. A very vague Smet Foundation proposal was given to the Society. A request was made at this time that the Stoughton Historical Society would like to be part of the discussions. This request was recognized by the Mayor and Chamber.

On December 10, our Historical Society officers attended the City Council's meeting where we were allowed to make a two minute public statement opposing the sale of the depot. Later that night, the Council met in a closed session and confirmed a deal that allows the Foundations 120 days to explore the possible purchase of the Depot.

We the Stoughton Historical Society need to be heard.

We have organized a public forum on January 21, 2025 at 6:30, at the Senior Center annex building. Snow date is set for January 22, same time and place. The depot will also be open from 4:30 to 6 o'clock for any interested parties that would like to see the building before our meeting.

We will be inviting the Chamber, City Council, R.D.A., Landmarks Commission, Smet Foundation and public to attend.

A short presentation will be made by the Stoughton Historical Society with time allowed for discussion, questions and answers. Hope to see you then.
